In 2018, UNICEF initiated the Generation Unlimited partnership at the global level. Within the overall Sustainable Development Goals framework, and the new UN Youth Policy 2030, Generation Unlimited provides an agenda that is universal in nature – all countries can and must do more to support the education, skills, and empowerment of young people.

India has the world's largest youth population with 333 million aged between 10-24 years. 

YuWaah Theory of Change




The mission of YuWaah is aligned with the Government of India's efforts to strengthen education, skills, empowerment and economic opportunities for young people, so they can both chart India's growth trajectory and gain from it.

YuWaah Approach

The mission of YuWaah remains fully aligned with the Government of India's ongoing efforts, drawing upon the growing recognition that investments in education, skills, empowerment and economic opportunities including entrepreneurship can serve as game changers for India's socio-economic development and growth story.

We will deploy a two-pronged strategy – of scaling up successful existing solutions and driving innovations to plug gaps







How will YuWaah operate?

UNICEF India is hosting a secretariat to support the YuWaah partnership. UNICEF's main role is to act as a catalyst and bring together key stakeholders to function as a think-tank and strategic action group on young people-led initiatives and advise on select strategies and ideas for YuWaah.

Partnership is at the heart of YuWaah. It will build upon significant assets of the partnership to realize its potential. Partners have signed statements of intent and expressed interest including -

- Industry associations
- Philanthropic Foundations
- UN Agencies and World Bank
- Civil society organizations

What's different about YuWaah?

- Young women and men play a strong leadership role as co-creators and agents of change
- Strong focus on gender and equity for vulnerable and marginalized groups
- Multi-sector collaborative approach to solve key problems, build on existing initiatives and avoid duplication
- Strong partnerships with the private sector that are grounded in shared value, harnessing core assets, and to go beyond corporate social responsibility and philanthropy
- Non-traditional approach to financing, focusing on using catalytic capital to crowd-in and coordinate additional investment, rather than creating a traditional fund
- Evidence-based advocacy based to shape future policies
